A How-To Spiritual Prep Guide for 2023



"The unexamined life is not worth living."

Socrates said the above words when he was faced with the decision to choose exile from philosophy and his religious practices or death. He was saying, "I would rather die than live a life of not being able to examine who I am and to fulfill my call in this world." He chose to drink the hemlock and died. In one sense he lives out the teaching of Jesus of he who would find his life must lose it, and he who wants to live must die."

If we do not examine our lives, we run the risk of looping into our failures, squandering our breath, existing in boredom--a hypnotic daze of absurdity. Jesus in rabbinic language said, "take my yoke upon you and learn of me." A yoke was a rabbinic metaphor for learning how to interpret life by linking up with a rabbi.

Examining your life involves taking inventory of your past, discernment of your present season, and planning out your near future all through the filter of God. This week we will examine our life through the words of Scripture as we prepare for 2023.


"We do not learn from our successes but from our failures. They are unassuming teachers from God in our transformation."

Follow the link above to the verse and read it in its context, paying close attention to the phrase "learn of me." Then return here.


Pray about this verse asking God to show you what he was teaching you in 2022.

God is constantly at work in our life talking, teaching, showing up, and transforming. The early followers of Jesus recognized this and talked about 'remembering' Jesus in communion, remembering the Word, remembering the Gospel. Remembering involves recollecting the past where God has shown up and the lessons God has been teaching to us.

"The difference between a hero and a villain is the hero examines herself and learns from her shadow-self, but villains never examine, they are ignorant of their own darkness."

Thursday

2023 Vision



Philippians 3:12-16

Follow the link above to the verses and read them paying close attention to the words vision and goal. Then return here.

Pray about these verses asking God to help you identify the one spiritual quest he is calling you to this year. Paul says, "this one thing I do." Do you know your one thing?

For Paul the goal is the vision, it was what he received on the Damascus Road to give witness to Jesus to the gentiles and to kings. At the end of his life he says, "I was not disobedient to the heavenly vision." A goal is a single calling, a single pursuit. As you think about next year identify your one thing you are going to "press toward" (in the words of Paul). Studies have shown that people with one goal accomplish it, 9/IO. People with 3-5 goals accomplish it I/IO. Paul accomplished so much for the kingdom because he knew his "one thing". What is your one thing?

What is the 'one thing', the 'higher calling' thing God is challenging you to this year?

If you say, "Im not sure what it is because I don't know the Voice of God in my life," well there's your one thing, discover the Voice in your life.

Friday

2023 PLANNING



Proverbs 21:5; 16:9; Jeremiah 29:10-14

Follow the link above to the verses and read them paying close attention to the word "plan." Then return here.

Now that you have one goal you will need a plan of attack. The little steps that will get you to the goal. A goal without a plan is a wish. Pray about these verses asking God to help you identify the difference between his plans and your plans.

Notice the movement of these verses, first the Sage (Proverbs) starts us off with how strategic planning puts you ahead whereas thoughtless rushing into the world with no plan puts you behind; then the Sage calls our attention to recognizing that without God our plans are futile. The Prophet (Jeremiah) chimes in and says, God has plans, hopes, and a future for the life of his children. And the way to engage and fulfill those plans is to "seek me with all your heart."

Lay out a plan of attack for your one spiritual goal.

Back to our goal of hearing the voice of God you plan may be to sit in silent prayer, listening to God for 15 minutes a day. Your plan needs to be inputs you can control.



Saturday

2023 PLANNING



Genesis 2:1-3; Exodus 20:8-9; John 10:10

Follow the link above and read these verses and then return here.

Pray about these verse and respond to the call to Sabbath and to live your life abundantly. Express to God your desire to live in his rest and to live an abundant life.

God created us to begin in rest. Our first day of life was a day of rest. We need to plan our rest or we wont do it, and we need out rest or we will burnout and quit before we reach the goal. Where are you planning your rest days? What is your rhythm?

Jesus came to give us an abundant life. What would it look like to live abundantly this year? What memories or experiences would make for an abundant year?



Plan out your rest, your sabbath, your vacations for the year. Include soul rest and spiritual rest in this plan.

Write down a couple memories or experiences you want to make this year as a way of stepping into your gifted abundant life.
